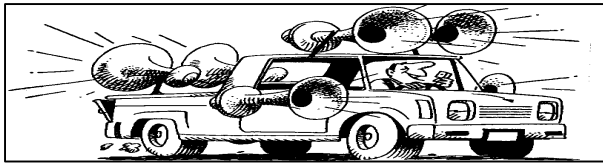

DEAL STRUCK ON “CASH FOR CLUNKERS”

As Part of Climate Bill, Consumers Trading In Cars Would Get Up to \$4,500.

This deal is part of climate change legislation being pieced together in the House. This is an auto deal forged by Democrats on the Energy and Commerce Committee. The plan would run for one year and offer vouchers to people who trade in vehicles which get less than 18 miles a gallon and be able to purchase a new car or light truck. The maximum dollar amount would be \$4,500 to people whose cars get at least 10 mpg or get a truck that is at least 5 mpg more efficient. This program is intended to encourage at least one million new car/truck purchases and also to support the ailing auto industry.

The legislation is stalled in disagreements among lawmakers over would-be costs to consumers and businesses. Republicans have issues with this climate initiative and the Democrats are haggling over details to curb greenhouse gas emissions.

President Obama urged Democrats to agree on a bill ahead of a Memorial Day deadline. He wants a bill that eases the costs imposed on consumers and businesses.

This bill calls for curbing U.S. emissions by about 80 percent below 2005 levels and would place a limit on overall emissions and force companies to hold permits that would allow them to emit greenhouse gasses. How much these permits would cost is not known or how much revenue would be raised.

House Rep. Edward Markey a co-sponsor (Democrat—Mass.) and Chairman Henry Waxman's Bill (Democrat-Calif.) want to speed the bill. Waxman is considering bringing the Bill to the full committee.

Waxman plans to discuss with members of the committee about the best way to proceed.

Obama would like to use the majority of the money raised by auctioning the permits to provide tax credits for the middle class, but lawmakers from the Rust Belt and coal states are pressing him to give some permits to industries in their regions for free. And Rep. Gene Green (Democrat-Texas) wants to give away some permits to ease the effect on businesses such as oil and gas refineries in his state.

OCCC REPORT

Leo Boyle our lobbyist and the OCCC Committee has been work with the SB 108 sponsor and were able to exempt the Horseless Carriage plate and the Collector Series plate will have only one fee assessed for the five years. This will be saving the Car Hobbyist over \$625,000. We are the only organization that received any kind of exemption, as we do not drive our collector vehicles daily.

This summer Leo and the Committee are working with the bill sponsor to clean up some gray area and consolidate all car laws so the Police, County Clerks and the State Patrol will have only one source for information for easier interpretation.

TREASURE TROVE, OR "THAT SURE LOOKS LIKE A CANNON TO ME"

On August 13th, 1813, just south of the Mission of San Antonio, in what is now Texas, over one thousand Tehanos (Residents of the area: American, Mexican, Spanish Deserters and American Indians) fought a pitched battle against the Spanish Garrison as part of the War of Mexican Independence. Although there are memorial signs around, the exact site of the battle remains a mystery, albeit with many hunches and guesses.

Based on a hot rumor of discovered artifacts on a particular ranch in the area, the Austin Community College planned an exploratory dig, led by Dr. Andres Tijerina, PhD, Texas History, and Dan Arellono, author of "Tehano Roots." Volunteers were called for.

This caught the eye of 'Max' the founder of Treasurenet.com, the primo website for dedicated treasure hunters. It did not take long for a full roster of metal detector fiends to sign up to help. (This 'meet-up' of Archeologists and Treasure Hunters is common in the UK).

So, early on Saturday morning, January 6th, 2008, thirty treasure Hunters, bearing beeping metal detectors, and around twenty assorted archeology and history buffs descended on the suspect site, shovels at the ready. They spread out among the curious cows to see what they could find. By noon they had uncovered the grand total of three Henry cartridge cases, two or three bullets, numerous lead musket balls, part of a plow hitch and a gate hinge.

Nothing at all that would indicate a battle site. Some of the searchers packed up to leave, others ventured further out. A junior treasure hunter who goes by the handle 'Cooltone23' got a big hit among a grove of young oaks. He dug down about a foot and struck IRON. Favorish digging uncovered an iron cylinder, tapered, about 18 inches long, with ribs and a curious raised inscription on the large end. Attracted by his excited yells, the dig leaders rushed up to see.

"Oh! My God" exclaimed Dan Arellono. "That looks like a Cannon" yelled another.

Attention was drawn to the corroded raised insignia. "Lets see - something D-E-B-A-K (Can't be a K, there's no K in Spanish- must be an R)-E ... Mmmm!"

What they had unearthed was an axle thimble from a STUDEBAKER wagon circa 1880!! Well, it sorta looks like a Cannon!

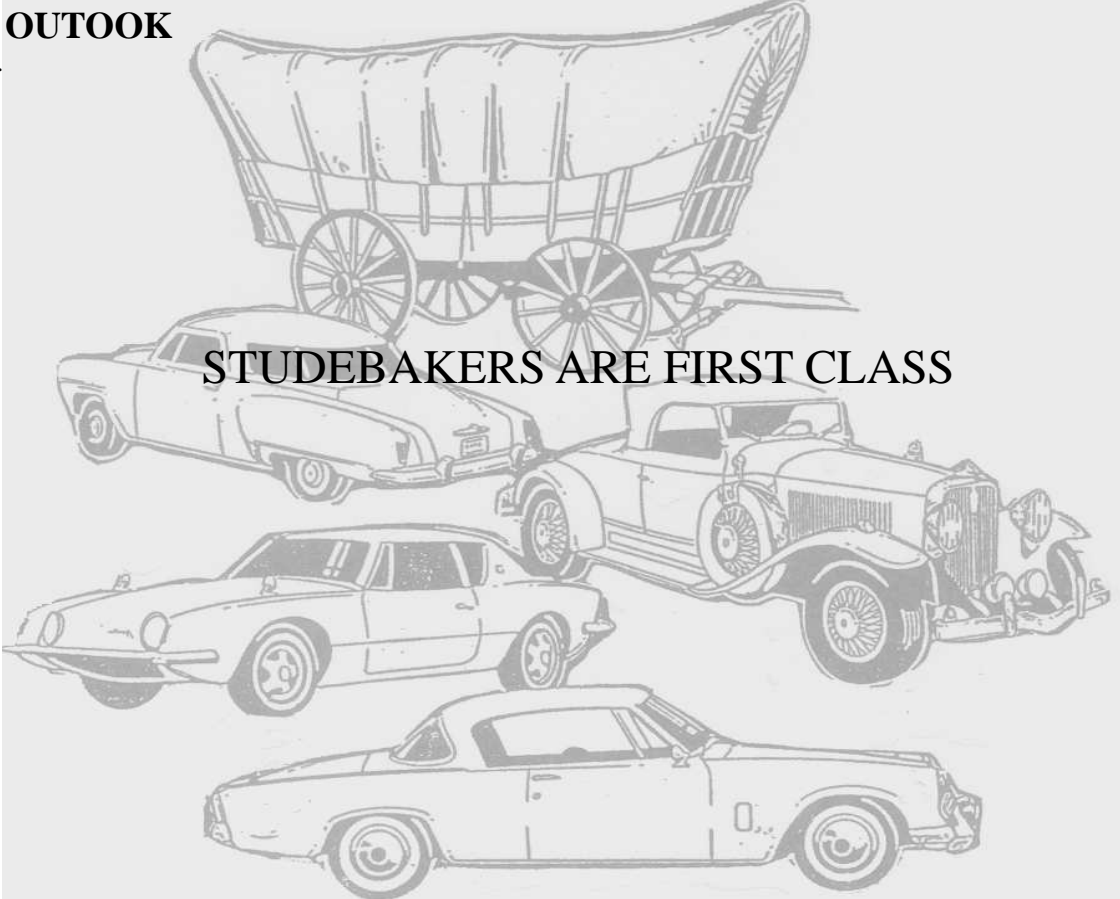
